Mallory-Neely House and Tennessee Homecoming Collection

Scope and Content

The Daughters of the American Revolution - Sons of the American Revolution -Children of the American Revolution (DAR-SAR-CAR) Chapter House of West Tennessee donated the contents of this collection to the Memphis and Shelby County Room in 1988. The collection is composed of materials collected from a 1986 scrapbook, created by the organization, whose headquarters were located at the former home of Daisy Mallory, the Mallory-Neely House. The scrapbook contained photographs, newspaper clippings, correspondence, and other documents detailing the organization's participation in "Tennessee Homecoming '86," a year-long, statewide celebration of Tennessee heritage and culture.

In Spring 1986, the organization completed a restoration of the Mallory-Neely House's boxwood garden. The organization also planted a Tulip Poplar tree given to the community by Tennessee Governor Lamar Alexander. The Chapter House also received a Certificate of Merit from the Tennessee Historical Commission for their contributions to the study and preservation of Tennessee's historical heritage.

In Fall 1986, the organization focused its projects on Benjamin Babb, a previous resident of their Chapter House. The group compiled a book, "Benjamin Babb from Virginia to Tennessee," and created an exhibit, "Benjamin Babb Years at 652 Adams: December 1864-July 1883." In August, the group participated in the 1986 Victorian Village Festival.
